FROM THE MUSIC DIRECTOR. **EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR.** AND BOARD CHAIR



Thank you for reviewing the Albany Symphony's 2018-19 Annual Report. We are delighted to share with you the season's highlights, which took place on concert stages, in our schools and libraries, senior communities and arts centers, and in our parks and on our riverfronts.

We want to call your attention to two streams that run through our season and indeed through the heart and history of the Albany Symphony: Community and Music of Our **Time**. This season, we redoubled our efforts to be more deeply infused by and into our community, to use our unique skill set as a top flight American orchestra to nourish, enrich, and inspire our community. Through the creation and creators of music of our time, we amplified the voices and concerns of today while connecting viscerally our history and our present. We brought people together with their different life perspectives to share in these common experiences.

In our 2018-19 season, the confluences of Community and Music of Our Time flowed into two wide and rich deltas:

- ARMISTICE CENTENNIAL (page 5 and 9) 12 events recitals, lectures, film screenings, a pop-up exhibit, a food drive - in collaboration with community partners commemorating the end of World War I and connected to the Symphony's performance of Benjamin Britten's War Requiem.
- SING OUT! NEW YORK (pages 6-7) Anchored by the centennial of the passage of the 19th Amendment and the 50th anniversary of the Stonewall uprising, our 2019 American Music Festival celebrated New York's leading role as a champion of equal rights through wall-to-wall programming, including four free community concerts.

We hope you will take the time to peruse our Strategic Priorities on page 11. We are in Year 2 of aligning our activities, culture, and goals toward our vision to *Transform the* lives of all people of the Capital Region through the power of music.

The work of the Albany Symphony is the result of tremendous dedication from many talented and passionately caring people. We would like to thank the Albany Symphony musicians for their artistry and dedication; the administrative staff for their tireless hard work and creativity; the Vanguard volunteers for the myriad ways they support our efforts; and the Board for their thoughtful governance, deep support, and great commitment to the Symphony and the community.



IMAGES FROM THE 2019 AMERICAN MUSIC FESTIVAL

1: The Dogs of Desire premiered 5 commissioned works inspired by New York's legacy as a champion for equal rights. Viet Cuong's Transfiguration commemorated the 50th Anniversary of the Stonewall uprising, a pivotal moment in the struggle for LGBTO equality. 2: Music rang out at Hudson Crossing Park in Schuylerville when the Albany Symphony and Capital Repertory Theatre brought the suffrage movement to life with Loren Loiacono's Petticoats of Steel. 3: By boat, by car, or by bike, over 12,000 people came out to enjoy summer and celebrate Sing Out! New York at the American Music Festival with FREE outdoor performances in Schuylerville, Albany, Schenectady, and Hudson. 4: The powerful words of Frederick Douglass echoed throughout Downtown Albany as the Albany Symphony and spokenword poets from Albany High School performed Andre Myers' hip-hop influenced work, Studies in Hope. 5: Live music is at the heart of Schenectady's Mohawk Harbor. The inspirational words and legacy of Sojourner Truth's Ain't I A Woman speech along with the music of Clarice Assad filled the harbor with the sounds of freedom and equality. 6: The Argus Quartet brought David Del Tredici's moving piano sextet, Bullycide, to St. Paul's Episcopal Church. 7 and 8: The Albany Symphony's mainstage performance featured John Corigliano's Piano Concerto with pianist Phillip Fisher and David Del Tredici's colorful Alice work, Pop-Pourri. 9: Back Barn Brewing Co. premiered the American Music Festival's signature beer - The 19th Amendment- at the First Draughts Reading Session. 10: Festival goers met vanguard composers John Corigliano and David Del Tredici before a private screening of a new documentary about the creation of Corigliano's Symphony No. 1 "Of Rage and Remembrance." 11: Composer/performer, Molly Joyce wowed the audience with her vintage toy organ on Friday night at the Festival's Late Night Lounge.

SYMPHONY IN OUR SCHOOLS

Formerly "Adopt-a-School," our newly branded flagship elementary program provided in-school musician visits to more than 1,600 **students** in the Albany, Troy, and Averill Park public school districts.



ARMISTICE CENTENNIAL

The Albany Symphony commemorated the 100th anniversary of the end of WWI with a festival encompassing 12 community events, including a food drive benefiting veterans in need; film screenings; a pop-up exhibit; and collaborations with local historians and artists. The festival culminated with the orchestra's performance of Benjamin Britten's monumental War Requiem. Audiences explored the "War to End All Wars" through films, lectures, and performances presented in collaboration with the Musicians of Ma'alwyck, Proctors, Schenectady County Historical Society, Discover Schenectady, and the New York State Museum.







LITERACY THROUGH SONGWRITING

25 students from Giffen and New Scotland Elementary Schools worked with Composer-Educator Angélica Negrón during **8 in-school visits** to create their own musical instruments and musical compositions, focusing on building skills in storytelling, teamwork, and communication.





SANDBOX PERCUSSION MASTERCLASS

The four percussionists of **Sandbox Percussion** gave a free masterclass, performance, and Q&A panel for students in music performance, music education, and music business at **The College of Saint Rose** prior to their opening night performance with the Albany Symphony.


A SPECIAL APPRECIATION FOR VANGUARD - ALBANY SYMPHONY INC.



NEW 4 YEAR COLLECTIVE BARGAINING AGREEMENT SIGNED WITH LOCAL 14 OF THE AMERICAN FEDERATION OF MUSICIANS (AFM)

In July, the Albany Symphony and the Albany Musicians' Association, Local 14 of the AFM signed a new four-year collective bargaining agreement, which was ratified by the Members of the Orchestra on July 22 and is effective through June of 2023. Representatives from the Albany Symphony Board of Directors, administrative staff, Albany Symphony Orchestra Committee, and Local 14 participated in the negotiations, which took place over a five-month period. Underlying the intensive process, the parties engaged in meaningful discussions about ensuring the artistic integrity and excellence of the Albany Symphony, the financial sustainability of the organization, and the role of the Albany Symphony and its musicians in serving the Capital Region through the power of music.
